California Mission Project

Due Date: Tuesday, May 2, 2017

The long awaited and much anticipated mission project is here! You will chose 1 of the project choices below to complete at home and bring to school.

- Build a model of your mission. This can be as simple or complex as you choose to make it, but make sure it is accurate to the real mission. No store bought kits allowed.
- Create a personal journal of one of the people that lived at the mission. This can be a made up journal, but it must be realistic and include 8 entries, and be a half-page each.
- Draw a floor plan of your mission on a poster board. 11x14 or bigger.
- Create a dictionary for your project that includes at least 12 definitions with a sentence for each word. This should be made into a book with a cover.
- Make a timeline of your mission that includes at least 10 important facts with dates that cover its history.
- Create a cookbook with recipes that might have been used during the mission time period. Choose 1 dish to make and bring into class to share.
- Design a slideshow that includes pictures and captions for the mission time period. You may include more than 1 mission if you like.
- Paint a picture of your mission on a canvas. You can use oil paints, water colors, or acrylic paints.
- Make a diorama of a Rancho home, a padre's quarters, or the inside of a mission. Be creative, make sure to cover all surfaces

- of your box, and remember to pay attention to all of the little details.
- Create a brochure for people who come to visit your mission.
 (see teacher for a template)
- Create a mission book- this can be a fictional story, or even a picture book. You will be required to write a story, add illustrations, and then create a book cover.
- Create a video tour of your mission. You become the tour guide, and take us on a historical tour.
- Mission Scrapbook. Make a scrapbook of your mission. Make the history of your mission come to life. Use photos, postcards, and be sure to journal all about the history of your mission.

- 2. Tour a mission and create a video tour explaining the parts of the mission, its history and its present day use. Show this to the class.
- 3. Compare 2 California missions.
- 4. Pretend you are Father Serra and write a diary of your journey through California.
- 5. Pretend you are a soldier at a Presidio and describe your life there.
- 6. Create a book of poetry with missions as your subject. Include at least 6 forms of poetry.
- 7. Pretend you are an Indian. Write an autobiography about your life before and after the Spanish came to California.
- 8. Make puppets and present a short puppet show about mission life.
- 9. Make a pamphlet or brochure about the mission.
- 10. Write a play dealing with missionaries and Indians. Present it to the class.
- II. Make a picture book about a mission, drawing the illustrations and writing the text.
- 12. Make a musical instrument, used at California missions, out of natural resources.
- 13. Create a diorama of a mission. Include the structures and surrounding landforms.
- I4. Research the food eaten at a mission and prepare a recipe from this time period. Bring it to class to share. Create a mission cookbook with at least four recipes.
- 15. Create a PowerPoint of your mission, highlighting the parts of the mission, its history and present day use.
- 16. Your own idea?
